Allergy and Clinical Immunology

Shanze (Sam) Wang (王山泽), MD, PhD Allergy Partners of Albuquerque, NM

Abstract: Dr. Wang will explain the concepts of immune system, immune response, antigen, and then allergy, immune deficiency and autoimmune disease. He will discuss in more details about the common environmental allergies, including allergic rhinitis, allergic conjunctivitis, and asthma. Then he will talk about food allergies in more details. He will also discuss briefly about a few skin disorders related to allergies, such as eczema (allergic dermatitis), hives (urticarial) and swelling (angioedema). Drug allergies are also common, and some drugs could be tested. Some gastrointestinal (GI) disorders are related to food allergies and also environmental allergies. Many people have reactions to be stings or ant bites. Anaphylaxis means severe or systemic reaction and is an emergency. Patients should carry epinephrine auto-injectors (Epipen or Auvi-Q or generic) all the time. Immune deficiency is a relatively rare but severe disorder, and patients should be evaluated and managed by an allergist/immunologist.

Biography: Dr. Wang obtained his MD in 1984 at Second Military Medical University, School of Medicine, Shanghai, China, and Ph.D. in 1999 in Clinical Immunology at Flinders University, South Australia. From 1999 to 2006, he was a Postdoctoral Fellow for 2 years, and then a Faculty as an Associate Scientist at the Asthma and Immunology Program, Lovelace Respiratory Research Institute, Albuquerque, NM. He returned to clinical track in 2006, as a Resident Physician of Internal Medicine at UNM, and then did his Fellowship in Allergy and Immunology from 2009 to 2011 at National Jewish Health and the University of Colorado, Denver. He got back to Albuquerque, in 2011 and joined Allergy Partners of Albuquerque, and has been working as an Allergist and Clinical Immunologist.
